We have continued with our Read Write Inc. spelling programme and I definitely think we are starting to see results across other subject areas. It is very interactive and the children enjoy trying to remember the rules, and testing each other on dictation, but more importantly learning all the different sounds which make up the English language. The children have found maths challenging trying out all the different strategies they have been learning during their addition and subtraction in mental maths. We have also been practising our times tables, division and also the relationship between that and fractions, and they have managed to understand them very well. We also work in small teams to do Problem Solving - this can be wordy problems where the children have to work out what is actually useful information, then work out what to use - addition, subtraction etc. We also do something called Brainsnack, where they have to look at the picture and work out what's different about the pattern and explain why. We have also been looking at Growth Mindset, investigating how we learn, what makes a good learner, how we can be successful learners and our Cuiken Toolkit has helped with this too. Putting this altogether, the children have become very enthusiastic about the process of learning and how they can improve their own learning. They are also doing a magnificent job learning French.







The final word must go to the children and we can discover their thoughts on what they liked over the last term.








